She has designed and made cutouts for opłatek wafer decorations for Pope John Paul II, and her wycinanki was presented by the Mazovian Voivode to the Dalai Lama, the spiritual leader of Tibet. Her passion for Kurpie Folk Art began as a child—her grandmother, mother, and aunt were all masters of this tradition. She works in Zagroda Kurpiowska as a museum guide and folk-art instructor. # DID YOU KNOW . . . . That the "Dożynki Harvest Festival" Can be Compared to Thanksgiving?

In Poland, people in farming communities began the exhausting work of harvesting their crops at the beginning of August. When finally completed, it was appropriate to offer thanks to God for a successful season and also to celebrate the rich harvest, the prospect of wealth, and the power of new life vested in the grain gathered during the summer. The nobility and landowners who depended on hired farm labor from all around the countryside rewarded their workers with a popular and colorful *Dożynki* event to celebrate.

Historically, the symbol of *Dożynki* is the *Wieniec*, (harvest wreath), which was presented to the land-owner by the field workers. This large wreath consisted of sheaves of a mixture of the most important grains — wheat and rye — which were bundled in creative ways to form large wreaths, crowns, crosses, and communion cups. Adorning the wreath were flowers and ribbons with additional decorations of hazelnuts, fruit of the mountain ash tree, apples, rowanberries, and gingerbread figures.

It was common practice to have the wreath and bread blessed at Mass in the local church followed by a procession to the Manor House. Traditional costumes of the region are worn, and in the old days, the best girl harvester (in Polish called "przodownica") wore a smaller version of the harvest wreath as a head piece. Upon arrival at the lord's estate, the harvest wreath was presented to the nobleman. It was also common practice to offer the lord and lady, on whose property the event takes place, a freshly baked babka or other loaf form of bread (the second important element) and salt, which are the traditional offerings of hospitality. Then the squire poured a measure of vodka for himself and the eldest male peasant to toast the entire congregation, and the pastor of the local church blessed the food to be consumed. Although the squire's family and staff participated in the feast - the typical menu consisted of peasant-style dishes rather than the more elaborate culinary fare customarily served in the manor house.
